Naomi is the author of the Edgar Award winning series about amateur detective and Japanese gardener Mas Alai. Her latest book, Strawberry Yellow, takes place in the strawberry fields of Watsonville, California. In keeping with the theme of her mystery, the topic of our forum this meeting (at two o'clock) will be ethnic mysteries. Be ready to talk about your favorite ethnic mystery, and bring some books to lend to fellow members, or for Gita's raffle if you are finished with them.

We will have the joint meeting with MWA this year at the August meeting. Pat Broeske came up with a wonderful idea for the meeting with a true crime theme about famous murders in Orange County. Just so you know, Naomi is a former president of MWA and the present president is our own Jeri Westerson. Maybe we can con Jeri into providing some of her famous mead for the meeting.

There are plenty of conferences and events for mystery lovers in other venues coming up. SinC LA and MWA are sponsoring the California Crime Writer's Conference in June in Pasadena. For those who like to travel and want an excuse to go to England, there is the Crime Fest in Bristol. And there is Malice in Baltimore, Magnum cum Murder in Indianapolis, and Bouchercon in Albany. Next year, Bouchercon will be right here in Long Beach. We have been working with Ingrid Willis, who is organizing next year's Bouchercon, on the possibility of putting on an all-day event for women of mystery. Stay tuned on that.

May 26th at 3:00 p.m. - Edgar Award winning author, Naomi Hirahara will be our speaker. Author of the Mas Arai series, her newest book is Strawberry Yellow.

Curmudgeonly Japanese American gardener and unwitting detective Mas Arai is back in his most compelling and evocative mystery yet, Strawberry Yellow. This fifth installment is set in the strawberry fields of Watsonville, California, where young Mas first arrived from Hiroshima in the 1940s. Now a semi-retired gardener who lives in an L.A. suburb, he returns for the funeral of a cousin and quickly gets entangled in the murder of a young woman. Was his cousin murdered, too?









Mas has to figure out what happened, keep himself safe in the face of considerable peril, and uncover the mystery of the Strawberry Yellow blight—and a new strawberry varietal so important that it could be inspiring a murderer.

At 2:00 p.m., Marlyn Beebee, a librarian from Los Alamitos, a reviewer and blogger, will lead the forum, discussing ethnic mysteries. Marlyn has been a librarian for 20 years and has worked with public, academic and special libraries. Her love of reading led to a blog called **Stuff and Nonsense**. It's mostly book reviews, but she posts other stuff and nonsense as well, including food porn, knitting porn and travel porn. She reads (and reviews) mostly mysteries, interspersed with general fiction, fantasy, and young adult literature.



Last month's meeting was held at Mystery Ink, where T. Jefferson Parker discussed his twentieth book, The Famous and the Dead, the sixth and final entry in his Charlie Hood series. Before a standing room only crowd, Parker discussed:

- --How the series' various titles allowed him to explore disparate locales, from the suburban streets of L.A. to the wide openness of the Antelope Valley.
- --How the character of Charlie Hood evolved from title to title. He started as a rookie detective with the sheriff's department...by book six he was working with the ATF, ostensibly to intercept illegal guns, but, the border being the border, much more took place.
- --As an author, Parker wanted to explore "the crazy, lawless world of Mexico" so he put Charlie in a small town near the U.S.-Mexican border. "I wanted to send him up the proverbial river...where he'd face things that would never happen in Orange County."

For those interested in reading the series from beginning to end, here's how the series plays out: L.A. Outlaws (2008), The Renegades (2009), Iron River (2010), The Border Lords (2011), The Jaguar (2012) and the new The Famous and the Dead.
