The always engaging T. Jefferson Parker spoke to a SRO crowd at the October 12 meeting, held at Mystery Ink Bookstore. He was there to launch his latest book, "Full Measure" (St. Martin's), which marks a genre departure for the three-time Edgar winner: it is literary fiction – not crime fiction.

It was, said Parker, "hugely inspired" by his adopted hometown of Fallbrook – in the same way that his first book, the mystery novel "Laguna Heat" (1985) was triggered by his feelings about Laguna Beach and all that it







represents. "Both books show how location impacts story," explained Parker.

"Full Measure" deals with a returning veteran of the war in Afghanistan. "I tried to make it as much a page-turner as the thrillers, but in a different way," said Parker, who focused on familial relationships and conflicts.

He spent three years working on the novel. For the prolific (more than 20 novels) Parker, venturing into new writing territory was like "opening a window and taking in a breath of fresh air."

But he hasn't given up on crime fiction. As he tells SinC board member Pat H. Broeske, in an interview about crime fiction that appears in the current issue (November) of *Orange Coast* magazine, "I'm only saying adios for now."



Jill Amadio has won an Irwin Award from the Book Publicists of LA for her debut mystery, "Digging Too Deep"...she's also a panelist at Bouchercon on Friday, November 14, at 8.30 a.m. on How Music is Used as an Element in authors' books. The major clue in Jill's book is a scrap of the score from an Arnold Schoenberg composition...she has just completed writing the biography of an athlete, as co-author.

In the latest issue (November) of *Orange Coast* magazine, Pat H. Broeske takes a look at the shadows amid the sunshine in "O.C. Confidential," a 12-page compendium about crime in the O.C. She talks to leading crime solvers (including cold case investigator Larry Montgomery of the D.A.'s office and O.C. Crime Lab forensic scientist Mary Hong), examines famous and not so well known cases, spotlights the body dump sites of Ortega Highway – and checks in on O.C.'s true crime writing and fiction scenes. (Did you know that the files of mystery maestro Ross Macdonald are at U.C. Irvine?) The issue is currently on the newsstands.

Weitz never lets this occasionally meandering narrative stay downbeat for long, however, and leaves readers looking forward to the next adventures featuring this lively, life-affirming protagonist. 
